You may enter as a team or by yourself. If you are not on a team, you will be matched with other individuals in the same division. If you cannot be matched up with a Team your entry fees will be refunded. Horse/Rider combination may participate on one team only. Horse may participate only once on a team. Teams may be made up by 3 to 4 members. Give your team name and the names of your known team members. If you don't enter with a name, management will create one for you. Teams with three members will have their scores averaged to create the 4th member score.

Each competitor will ride one dressage test and one equitation test per level.

These will be averaged 50% each. All scores from each team will be counted. No dropped scores. Total points from each team member will be added together and divided by the number of team members to determine Team placing. Elimination from one test does not eliminate that rider from the team competition. It will count as a zero in the calculations.

Whips and readers are permitted for these classes.

DIVISIONS MAY BE CHANGED OR COMBINED DEPENDING ON ENTRIES.

Equitation Class Protocol

Times will be posted and riders will compete in appropriate sized groups for safety. Riders on two teams ride only once: score will count for both teams. Riders are required to:

Check in with the paddock steward prior to the assigned times.

Stay in the area so that further instructions from the paddock steward can be heard.

Any person interfering with the paddock steward or TD during equitation warm-ups may incur elimination of the rider involved from the class.

Rider and Owner must be a current CDS members when scores are earned

SCORES: A horse/rider combination must achieve the following for qualification at the various levels for the CDS JR/YR Championships.

Introductory AB 3 scores of 60% or better with 2 different judges
Training Level 3 scores of 62% or better with 2 different judges
Second Level 3 scores of 60% or better with 2 different judges
Second Level 3 scores of 57% or better with 2 different judges
Third Level 3 scores of 57% or better with 2 different judges
FEI JR/YR Levels 3 scores of 57% or better with 2 different judges
FEI Children 3 scores of 57% or better with 2 different judges
FEI Pony 3 scores of 57% or better with 2 different judges
Third Level 3 scores of 57% or better with 2 different judges
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EXTRAS

CDS TEAM COMPETITION: to be held at the CDS JR/YR Championship Shows. They will be held at Training, First, Second, Third, Fourth and FEI Levels. There are no prequalification requirements for the CDS Team Competition except that the rider must be a member of CDS.

EXTEND THE CHAMPIONSHIP EXPERIENCE: There is a new Championship Division designed especially for those who have qualified to enter the Junior/Young Rider Championship Classes, designed to help competitors prepare for any Championships that they may enter in the future. Championship Competition computation will be 60% (dressage tests average), 20% (freestyle), 5% (jog skills), 15% (team theory). Rider will also be judged on in-hand jog skills and will participate in a Theory test.

In addition to the Individual Championship classes and the Team Competitions, **LEADLINE for 8 and under**, open classes, pas de deux, freestyle and quadrille are offered. There is no prior qualification for these classes, other than the standard freestyle requirements. Juniors and Young. When the show is recognized by USEF/ USDF, GreatAmericanInsurance Qualfiying classes will be offered.

Previous JR/YR Champion and Reserve winners may not compete at the JR/YR Championship at the same level with the same horse at Training or First Level.

For purposes of competition in the Dressage Division: Individuals are eligible as Juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Individuals are eligible as Young Riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21.

The Championship classes will be the two highest tests of the level and Intro A and B. The Champion will be the horse and rider combination that achieves the highest combined percentage in those two tests. Honor Rounds are mandatory and require that the horse and rider appear in appropriate attire. The new Introductory Level is limited to 13 and under and may not cross enter any other classes.

Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current US Equestrian Rule Book and will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

Management reserves the right to arrange for additional judges and to cancel, combine or amend any class including, but not limited to class awards, scheduling and location without claim to damages.

Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, without claim to damages.

Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to, or arising out of, or incident to the show, without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered by these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Show Management and such determinations shall be final.

Owner/Agent/Participant agrees that every horse entered, or which they bring to the showgrounds will be subject to the rules of the show management. However, show management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur for any horse entered or on the showgrounds, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the United States Equestrian Federation, The United States Dressage Federation, the California Dressage Society, the San Francisco Peninsula Chapter, The Horse Park at Woodside, and any additional recognizing organizations, the Horse Show and its management, employees, volunteers and independent contractors for any loss, accident to her/his horse/horses or equipment which may occur.

All Owners and Exhibitors will be held responsible for any damage incurred by them, their agents, employees or animals to stall buildings and other properties on the showgrounds and shall be billed accordingly. All bills for veterinary, farrier services and feed are due and payable during the show. Show Management reserves the right to deduct any unpaid veterinary, farrier and feed bills from prize money or refunds due the exhibitor.

Competitors are responsible for all INSURANCE for themselves, employees, owners, horses, etc. Competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, agents or horses. They are strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad and to keep the policy current.

Current USEF, USDF and FEI Tests will be used.

USEF General Rules define the protest procedure.

An Exhibitor's Letter with updates may be included with riding times. Information in this document is considered to be as binding as any other rule or procedure stated in this Prize List.

ENTRIES, SCHEDULING, RIDE TIMES, FREESTYLES, MISCELLANEOUS

Entries will be accepted on a first come basis and must include all fees, signatures and copies of memberships and horse registration proofs, signatures and payment. Numbers will not be released until this process is complete: entries without payment in full may be returned. Enter on Fox Village at https://entry.foxvillage.com/ or download Prize List at www.sfpcds.org. Send entry to: SFP 53rd Annual Show, c/o Gigi Cunliffe Noerr, 11 Monticello Ct, Woodside, CA 94062. Management will close show when it is full and place any additional entries on a waiting list. Mailed entries will be charged an additional \$25.

Entries close and must be received by July 12, 2024. If accepted, late Entries will be charged \$50. All change requests must be in writing and will be charged \$25 per change. Once the show is scheduled, the fee paid for a scratched class will not be returned.

No refund of entry fee after closing date. No refunds of stabling after closing date. No exceptions. No fax entries accepted.

Checks returned by the bank will be assessed a \$100 fee. A cashier's check or cash will be needed to clear the entry. Checks will not be run through a second time.

Copies of all membership cards and horse recording certificates are required. Incomplete entries will be charged \$25. The requirements of USEF, USDF and CDS will be strictly followed and the show will collect fees for any individual or horse registration that is required and cannot be proven by presentation of the current card. To enter the Adult Amateur Division, the USEF Membership card MUST indicate Amateur and the individual must reach the age of 22 in the current year. If you do not submit proof of Adult Amateur status, you will be entered in the Open Division. If you request to switch to Adult Amateur classes after entry closing, all post and/or change fees will be applied if this requires that you be rescheduled.

The published schedule will be followed as closely as possible, but judges may be changed or added. Classes will be schedule to accommodate the judges, riders and management. Rider scheduling preferences, if noted on the entry, will be indulged when possible. The 50 minutes between rides will be observed for riders of multiple horses. Requests for specific break parameters will be considered, but not guaranteed. Classes will not necessarily be scheduled in order of difficulty.

FREESTYLE PREREQUISITE: It is required to submit proof of competency with your entry. Except for USEF/USDF Championship classes and for FEI Pony Riders, FEI Junior an FEI Young Riders Freestyles, in order to enter a freestyle class at any level, a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of 63% for Training through Fourth Level and 60% for FEI Levels in the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of a higher level at a Federation/USDF Licensed Dressage Competition or FEI recognized Dressage Competition or "open" Dressage class (i.e., open to all breeds) at a Federation Licensed Competition held prior to the competition where the horse/rider combination is entered to ride a freestyle class. A photocopy of the test verifying eligibility must be submitted with the entry for a freestyle class. See DR1299 for more information. The qualifying test must have been achieved at a Federation Licensed or FEI recognized Dressage Competition or "open" Dressage class (i.e. open to all breeds) at a Federation Licensed Competition held prior to the competition where the horse/rider combination is entered to ride a freestyle class. A photocopy of the test verifying eligibility must be submitted with the entry for a freestyle class. The qualifying percentage can be found in the current USEF Rule Book. Music review with announcer will be posted Thursday, July 25, 2024 by 1pm.

Provisional ride times will be posted on www.foxvillage.com and the SFP website www.sfpcds.org. Official ride times will be posted by 12noon at the showgrounds on Thursday, July 25, 2024, the day before the show. It is the obligation of the entrant to contact the show secretary if ride times have not been received. Scheduling conflicts must be e-mailed to the show secretary 48 hours prior to the start of the show. Next day's schedule is posted every evening at the show office.

JUNIORS

All minors/juniors must be supervised by their parent/guardian or authorized agent at all times while at or on the showgrounds, whether riding or on foot. The parent/guardian or authorized agent shall assume all responsibility to protect juniors from any injury, damage, harm and/or loss and shall indemnify, defend and hold show management, its employees, independent contractors and volunteers, The Horsepark at Woodside, and all affiliated organizations harmless therefrom.

US EQUESTRIAN GR 1301.S: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state of California will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule is solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against the parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the minor committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchair and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties.

ALL COMPETITORS

From the time the horse(s) are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses and those competing in any classes and/or tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear may be the same as or a coordinating color with the coat, and may include contrast coloring, accent, and crystal decoration. See DR 136 for dress code rules for exhibitions.

All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

The Federation, The Horsepark at Woodside and the San Francisco Peninsula Chapter of CDS make no representation or warranty, express or implied, about any protective headgear, and cautions riders that death or serious injury may result despite wearing such headgear as all equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risk and as no helmet can protect against all foreseeable injuries.

The dressage equipment rules will be in place from the moment of arrival on the showgrounds and will be in force for the duration of the show. See DR121.

SafeSport - USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. enter for SafeSport Code, USEF SafeSport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

The Horsepark at Woodside is not responsible for any equipment, boxes, miscellaneous materials shipped to the facility.

There will be food available for purchase at the showgrounds.

DOGS MUST BE ON LEASH AT ALL TIMES and owners must be able to provide proof of current rabies vaccination. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to penalty under Facility, Show and USEF Rules. The issuance of warning cards is a possibility. Additionally, there is a minimum fine of \$100 per occurrence and owner maybe refused entry into future shows. Any damage whatsoever that is attributed to the dog is the complete financial and any other responsibility of the owner of the dog.

All classes will be held in outdoor arenas 20m x 60m. Warm-up in covered arena. Footing in arenas is combination synthetic material/silica sand, sand.

Lunging is permitted in designated lunging areas only. Do not lunge in warm-up arena or show arenas.

NO ONE ON FOOT WILL BE ALLOWED IN WARM-UP ARENAS.

Bridle numbers must be worn at all times. Use of warm-up arenas is limited to those entered in the show, and at the discretion of the show management, will be further restricted to those warming up for the classes in progress when there is congestion.

Competitors who are not also members of The Horse Park are not permitted to use "Member Only" arenas.

Stabling consists of permanent 10' x 12' stalls with bottom doors. Stabling will be assigned in order of receipt of entry. The same charge will apply whether stall is used for a horse, tack or grooming. By renting a stall at The Horse Park, you agree to abide by the stall use policies. Stabling available Thursday, July 25, 2024 at 12noon and must be vacated by 7:00p.m. Saturday, July 27, 2024. Additional stabling available at \$125/day. Application for stabling must be made on entry. Stalls are \$200 for the Show. There is a \$50 trailer-in fee for those horses not stabled on the grounds. Please park in designated areas only. Trailers entering stable area shall enter on north side and exit south side.

ALL COMPETITORS cont'd

Feed/Bedding – Hay options are alfalfa, alfalfa/grass mix, meadow grass, orchard and timothy. Bagged shavings are available for purchase. The Horsepark at Woodside requires horses staying overnight in stabling use a minimum of three (3) bags of shavings for 10' x 12' stalls. Shavings can be purchased before arriving and during the show. No outside shavings will be allowed. Fill out and return the enclosed order form for pre-purchase of feed or shavings. During the show, bedding & feed orders must be placed before 11:00a.m. for same day delivery.

Horse Show Office will be open on Thursday, July 25, 2024 from 12noon to 4:00p.m. and will open on show days one hour before the first class and remain open until one hour after the last class of the day.

In accordance with the rules of USEF Bio-Hazardous Medical Waste containers are provided in the stable area and in the Show Office. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.

Equine diseases are known factors that could potentially impact the organizer's ability to run competition as scheduled. USEF and the EDCC offer a notification system to advise of equine diseases that could affect your participation in a licensed competition. If the competition is called due to a mandatory quarantine by CDFA or USDA prior to closing date, competitors will receive a refund of all show fees less \$100 to their original form of payment.

DURING COMPETITION: ALL HORSES STABLED ON THE SHOWGROUNDS AND HAUL-INS ARE REQUIRED TO TAKE THE TEMPERATURE OF YOUR HORSE TWICE A DAY. This is mandatory! A temp log will be e-mailed to you and available at check-in. It must be posted on your stall and you must take your horse's temperature twice daily - 1x AM and 1x PM. Bring your own horse thermometer - as temps must be taken—those not adhering to the temperature will be asked to leave.

TROPHIES - There will be two scheduled times each day, Friday and Saturday, when trophy winners will have the opportunity to take photos with the show photographer, or the photographer of their choice in our Winner's Circle. Trophy photo opportunity times will be posted Thursday afternoon.

The Horsepark at Woodside Stall Use Policy

Any damages to rental stalls will be the financial responsibility of the owner, exhibitor and/or trainer. Please review the following guidelines and contact the main office with any questions or concerns.

Do not damage stalls. No staples, nails, bolts, screws, liquid nail, rubber cement, duct tape, paint or other products to be used on or in the stalls.

Decorations must be attached using temporary set-ups (wire or plastic ties) and removed prior to checkout.

Name cards must be removed prior to checkout and leave no residue on stall surfaces.

Do not remove any part of the stalls.

Dispose of manure only in dumpsters.

No vehicles in stabling area or in the aisles between stall rows.

<u>USDF Membership Benefits</u>: USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Member Guide* or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those
 sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at
 Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are
 exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot,
 academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

2024 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2024 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s).
 A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Active or Life Membership or Annual or Life Recorded Farm/Business). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF.
 For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.
- * PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division.

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USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of individual members and over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.


*** BIOSECURITY ***

- Sanitize stalls before use
- Limit horse to horse contact
- Limit horse to human contact
- Avoid sharing of equipment, including tack, water buckets, brushes, wipe rags, etc.
- · Avoid use of communal water troughs
- Avoid submerging end of water hoses in buckets
- Avoid tying horses to fences or gates
- Cover all feed and hay to prevent access by vermin, birds or other animals
- Monitor your horse frequently for signs of disease during the event
- Immediately report any sick horse(s) to designated event official or veterinarian

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
